Program overview

Type of degree: Single-Cycle Master's Degree (300 ECTS credits)

Classification: LM-13 (as per Ministerial Decree 270/2004)

Duration: Five years

Language of instruction: English

School: Mathematics, Physics, and Natural Sciences

Department: Biology

Classes begin on October 2026.

Attendance at lectures and laboratory sessions is **mandatory**.

The program is delivered entirely in English.

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Art. 1 — Program capacity and selection procedure

For the academic year **2026/2027**, Tor Vergata University of Rome announces a public selection procedure for admission to first year of the **Single-Cycle Master's Degree Programme in Pharmacy (taught in English)**.

A total of **80 places** are available, allocated as follows:

- **60 places** for Italian citizens, EU citizens, and non-EU citizens legally residing in Italy pursuant to Article 26 of Law No. 189/2002;
- **20 places** reserved for non-EU citizens residing abroad who require a study visa.

The number of available places is established pursuant to **Article 2 of Law No. 264 of 2 August 1999**.

The selection procedure will take place **in a single round**, covering the total number of places available for the programme.

Important notice

- For application deadlines, procedures, and the structure of the selection process, applicants must refer to **Articles 3, 4 and 5** of this Call.
- In order to register for the selection procedure and subsequently enrol in the programme, applicants must strictly comply with the **deadlines and procedures specified in this Call**.
- Only candidates who are declared successful according to the **ranking list referred to in Article 9** will be able to proceed with enrolment, following the procedures described in **Article 11**.

The programme is offered by the **Department of Biology within the School of Mathematics, Physics and Natural Sciences**, in cooperation with the **School of Medicine and Surgery**.

Art. 2 - Admission requirements

The selection procedure is open to:

- Italian citizens;
- citizens of European Union Member States;
- non-EU citizens legally residing in Italy pursuant to Article 26 of Law No. 189/2002;
- international applicants residing abroad who require a study visa.

To be eligible for admission, applicants must hold:

- an **upper secondary school diploma** awarded in Italy; or
- a **foreign secondary school qualification** recognised as suitable for admission to Italian universities in accordance with current legislation (see **Article 14** of this Call).

Students who are currently enrolled in the **final year of secondary school** may also apply, provided that they:

- attend the final year of an Italian secondary school; or
- attend the final year of a foreign secondary school whose qualification is recognised as valid for admission to Italian universities.

In these cases, the final qualification must be obtained **before the enrolment deadlines specified in this Call**.

Art. 3 – Admission procedure and participation in the selection

To participate in the selection procedure described in this Call, applicants who meet the requirements set out in **Article 2** must complete **both of the following steps, under penalty of exclusion from the selection process**.

A) Taking the CEnT-S (CISIA English Test – Sciences)

Applicants must take the **CEnT-S test** organised by the **CISIA Consortium (Consorzio Interuniversitario Sistemi Integrati per l'Accesso)** according to the procedures, calendar and locations published on the CISIA website:

For the purposes of this Call, both of the following test formats are considered valid:

- **CENT@UNI** – in-person test at a university test centre
- **CENT@CASA** – online proctored test taken remotely

The test must be taken **between 1 November 2025 and 9 June 2026** at any university authorised to administer the CEnT-S test.

B) Submission of the application through the Delphi portal

Applicants must also submit their application for participation in the selection procedure and inclusion in the ranking list through the University's online services portal **Delphi**:

Application period:

18 February 2026 – 12 June 2026

Submitting the application through the Delphi portal is **mandatory** in order to participate in the selection procedure and to be included in the ranking list.

In addition, all candidates who are correctly registered on the Delphi portal and who have taken the **CEnT-S test within the deadlines specified above** must take an **oral interview to verify English language proficiency at B2 level** (see **Article 6**).

Art. 4 - Registration for the CEnT-S (CISIA) test and test contents

Registration for the **CEnT-S (CISIA English Test – Sciences)** must be completed through the CISIA website:

Registration procedure

1. Applicants must register in the **CISIA reserved test area** on the portal [cisiaonline.it](https://www.cisiaonline.it) through the online registration form, set their login credentials, and activate their account through the confirmation email sent to the address provided during registration.
2. Using the credentials created during registration, applicants must access the reserved area and select:
 - the test delivery mode (CENT@UNI or CENT@CASA);
 - the university test centre;
 - the date on which they wish to take the test;
 - the payment method;
 - in the case of CENT@CASA, the country in which they will take the test.
3. Applicants must pay the **test registration fee of €55.00**, payable by credit card or by bank payment (MAV).

The payment receipt will indicate the **date and time of the test**.

The test **cannot be taken on a date different from the one selected during registration**.

The booking may be modified only if:

- registration for the selected test session is still open;
- the payment status is marked as **completed**.

Technical requirements for the CENT@CASA test

Applicants who choose to take the test online (**CENT@CASA**) must ensure that they meet the required **technical and environmental conditions** described in the CISIA guidelines.

In particular, applicants must verify:

- the required **technical equipment and system requirements**;
- the **room configuration requirements** for the online proctored test.

Failure to comply with these requirements may prevent the applicant from taking the test.

Structure of the CEnT-S test

The CEnT-S test consists of **55 questions divided into five sections**:

Section	Number of Questions	Time
Mathematics	15	30 minutes
Reasoning on texts and data	15	30 minutes
Biology	10	20 minutes
Chemistry	10	20 minutes
Physics	5	10 minutes

Total duration: **110 minutes**

Scoring system

The score for each test is calculated as follows:

- **Correct answer:** +1 point
- **Incorrect answer:** -0.25 points
- **Unanswered question:** 0 points

Test calendar and registration deadlines

Applicants may take the CEnT-S test at **any university offering the test**, provided they comply with the deadlines indicated in this Call.

Important notice

Each test session has a **maximum number of participants**, depending on the capacity of the examination rooms.

For this reason, applicants are strongly advised to **register well in advance**.

Once the available places for a test session are filled, **registrations will be closed**.

Registration for each test date closes several days in advance according to the following schedule:

Art. 5 - Submission of the application through the Delphi portal

In order to participate in the selection procedure for admission to the **Single-Cycle Master's Degree Programme in Pharmacy**, applicants must apply through the University's online services portal **Delphi**.

Applications must be submitted exclusively online during the following period:

18 February 2026 – 12 June 2026

Application procedure

1. Access the University online services portal:

2. Select:

Student Area → Button 1 → **“Registration for admission tests”** → **“Complete the application”**

3. Confirm that you have read the privacy notice and select:

School of Mathematics, Physics and Natural Sciences

4. Select the appropriate category:
 - **Italian, EU and non-EU citizens legally residing in Italy** → non-reserved places
 - **Non-EU citizens residing abroad requiring a study visa** → reserved places
5. Complete the application form by entering all required personal data.

Applicants must enter their **first name and surname exactly as they appear on their passport or other valid identification document.**

Required documents

All applicants must upload:

- a **valid identification document.**

Applicants wishing to be exempt from the English oral interview must upload:

- a **B2-level English language certificate** (see Article 6).

Non-EU citizens legally residing in Italy must also upload:

- a **valid residence permit;**
- if expired, the expired permit together with proof of renewal.

They must also declare whether they are currently enrolled at **Tor Vergata University of Rome or at another Italian university, and specify whether they are enrolled in a degree programme or in single-subject courses.**

Important note:

Applicants legally residing in Italy with a residence permit for study purposes obtained for enrolment in single-subject courses may participate in the selection procedure **as equivalent to EU candidates.** If admitted, they may enrol only if BOTH of the following conditions are met:

- the single course is relevant to the Pharmacy programme;
- the single course has been successfully completed within the enrolment deadlines and, in any case, no later than 7 October 2026.

Failure to meet one of these conditions will result in exclusion from enrolment and removal from the ranking list.

Application validation

At the end of the procedure, the system will generate:

- the **application form**, and
- a **zero-amount payment slip** containing a **CTRL code** and an **AUTH code**.

Applicants must:

- print the application form and payment slip;
- access the Delphi portal again;
- enter the CTRL and AUTH codes in order to **validate the application**.

Only after this validation step will the application be considered **successfully submitted**. Once validated, the application **cannot be modified**.

The University reserves the right to verify the accuracy of the declarations provided. False declarations may result in **exclusion from the selection procedure**.

Art. 6 – Selection procedure, contents and evaluation criteria

The purpose of the selection procedure is to verify that candidates possess an **adequate initial academic preparation** and an appropriate aptitude for the subjects included in the programme (pursuant to Article 6, paragraph 1 of Ministerial Decree 270/2004), as well as **adequate proficiency in the English language**, as required by the regulations of the Single-Cycle Master's Degree Programme in Pharmacy.

Admission to the programme consists of **two stages of evaluation**.

a) CEnT-S (CISIA) test

The first stage of evaluation is based on the **score obtained in the CEnT-S test**, organised by CISIA and administered in English.

The score obtained in the test will be considered by the **Examining Board as the primary criterion** for establishing the merit ranking list referred to in Article 9.

If a candidate has taken the CEnT-S test more than once, **the highest score obtained will be taken into consideration** for the ranking list.

For the purposes of the ranking, the “score” always refers to the normalised score as defined in the CISIA regulations.

There is **no minimum score requirement** for the CEnT-S test.

b) Oral interview

The second stage of evaluation consists of an **oral interview** intended to assess the candidate's **knowledge of the English language at B2 level**, according to the **Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR)**.

The interview will be assessed on a **pass/fail basis**. No numerical score will be assigned.

Only candidates who obtain a **positive assessment** in the interview will be included in the ranking list. Candidates who do not pass the interview will be **excluded from the ranking list**.

The oral interview will take place **online**, starting at **10:00 a.m. (Italian time) on 6 July 2026**, following the alphabetical order of the candidates who have taken the CEnT-S test within the deadlines specified in this Call.

If necessary, the interview process may continue over several days.

A list indicating the **time at which each candidate will be interviewed** will be published on the website of the Pharmacy degree programme.

The interviews will be conducted exclusively through the **Microsoft Teams platform**.

Candidates admitted to the interview must connect on **6 July 2026 at 10:00 a.m. (Italian time)** using the link that will be published on the programme website.

Candidates are responsible for ensuring the availability and proper functioning of the required equipment (**computer, webcam and audio**) and for having a **reliable internet connection**.

It is the candidate's responsibility to ensure the availability and proper functioning of the required hardware (computer, webcam, audio), software, and a reliable internet connection.

Candidates who fail to attend the interview at the scheduled time or who are unable to guarantee a stable audio-video connection for the entire duration of the interview will be excluded from the final ranking list.

Exemption from the oral interview

Candidates who possess a **valid B2-level English language certification** issued by recognised institutions may be exempted from the oral interview.

Accepted certifications include, for example:

- Cambridge English Language Assessment
- IELTS
- Trinity College London
- ETS
- TOEIC
- TOEFL iBT
- Pearson EDEXCEL / EDI

- English Speaking Board (ESB)
- Anglia Ascentis Certificate
- Aim Awards (General English / Business English)
- London Chamber of Commerce and Industry (LCCI)
- British Institutes

Candidates who have obtained a **degree from a programme taught in English**, as well as candidates who are **citizens of countries where English is the official language** and who have obtained a degree at an Italian university including at least **3 ECTS credits in English language**, may also be exempt.

The English language certification must be uploaded on the **Delphi portal** during the application procedure (see Article 5).

The Examining Board will evaluate the submitted documentation and determine whether the candidate qualifies for exemption.

Art. 7 - Additional learning requirements (OFA)

Candidates admitted to the programme who do not achieve the minimum score required in certain sections of the CEnT-S test will be assigned **Additional Learning Requirements (Obblighi Formativi Aggiuntivi – OFA)**.

OFA will be assigned to candidates who obtain:

- a score lower than **4** in the sections **Mathematics, Biology or Chemistry**, or
- a score lower than **2** in the section **Physics**.

The assignment of OFA is carried out on a subject-by-subject basis depending on the sections in which the minimum score has not been achieved.

The assigned OFA will be considered fulfilled upon passing the following curricular examinations:

- **Applied Mathematics**
- **Pharmaceutical Biology**
- **General and Bioinorganic Chemistry**
- **Applied Physics**

Students will **not be allowed to take second-year examinations** until these requirements have been fulfilled.

Art. 8 - Examining Board and administrative officer

The **Examining Board** responsible for the selection procedure will be appointed by the Rector by means of a formal decree, upon proposal of the Director of the Department of Biology.

The **Administrative Officer responsible for the procedure**, pursuant to Article 4 of Law No. 241/1990, is:

Art. 9 – Merit ranking list

The **general merit ranking list** will be prepared by the Examining Board.

Only candidates who meet the following conditions will be included in the ranking list:

- have taken the **CEnT-S (CISIA) test** between **1 November 2025 and 9 June 2026**;
- have submitted the application on the **Delphi portal** between **18 February 2026 and 12 June 2026**;
- have passed the **oral interview** or have been granted exemption.

The University will acquire the **CEnT-S scores directly from CISIA** using the candidate's Italian Fiscal Code. Candidates must ensure that the same Fiscal Code is correctly entered on both the CISIA platform and the Delphi portal. Any discrepancy or incorrect entry will result in the impossibility of retrieving the score and, consequently, exclusion from the ranking list.

The ranking list will be determined solely on the basis of the **CEnT-S score obtained during the period specified above**. The oral interview will **not contribute to the numerical score**, but only determine eligibility.

In the event of a tie, priority will be given to the candidate with the **highest score in the Chemistry section**. If the tie persists, the **younger candidate** will be ranked higher.

The **general merit ranking list** will be published on:

- the University website
- the School of Science website
- the Pharmacy programme website

Publication of the ranking list will constitute **official notification to candidates**. No individual communications will be sent.

A **separate ranking list** will be prepared for non-EU citizens residing abroad who require a visa.

Publication of the ranking list will take place **from 16 July 2026**.

Enrolment deadlines

Submission of the enrolment application on Delphi:
by 2 September 2026

Payment of the first instalment of tuition fees:
by 11 September 2026

Candidates admitted who fail to meet these deadlines will be considered to have **renounced their place**.

Art. 10 – Supplementary ranking lists and confirmation of interest in enrolment

If places become available due to withdrawals by admitted candidates, **supplementary ranking lists (sliding lists)** will be published.

First supplementary ranking list

Publication date: **from 15 September 2026**

Candidates admitted through this list must complete enrolment within the following deadlines:

Submission of enrolment application on Delphi:
by 18 September 2026

Payment of the first instalment:
by 23 September 2026

Confirmation of interest

Candidates who are eligible but not admitted in the first supplementary ranking list and who wish to remain eligible must **confirm their interest in enrolment** through the Delphi portal **by 23 September 2026**.

Failure to confirm interest in enrolment within the deadlines will result in the irreversible loss of the candidate's position in the ranking list, and the candidate will be considered to have withdrawn.

Second supplementary ranking list

Publication date: **from 28 September 2026**

Enrolment deadlines:

Submission of enrolment application:
by 1 October 2026

Payment of first instalment:
by 7 October 2026

Only candidates who have confirmed their interest in enrolment according to the procedure described above will be included in subsequent supplementary ranking lists.

Further supplementary ranking lists may be published if places remain available.

Candidates who are not admitted in a supplementary ranking list and who wish to remain eligible for further rounds must confirm their interest again for each subsequent round through the Delphi portal.

Failure to do so will result in permanent exclusion from the ranking list.

A specific notice will be published indicating the procedures and deadlines for each additional round.

Art. 11 – Enrolment procedure

Candidates admitted through the ranking lists must complete the **enrolment procedure within the deadlines specified above**, following the instructions available at:

Candidates who fail to enrol within the specified deadlines will be considered to have **withdrawn from admission**. Any changes to the procedures described in this article will be communicated at the time of publication of the ranking lists on the official University websites.

Candidates holding foreign qualifications or requiring a visa must refer to **Article 14**.

Art. 12 - Tuition fees

Information regarding **tuition fees, payment deadlines and payment procedures** will be published in the **Student Handbook for the 2026/2027 academic year**, available on the University website:

The Student Handbook will also include information regarding **full or partial exemptions from tuition fees**.

Art. 13 – Transfers, change of programme and advanced standing

Admission through the procedure described in this Call is also required for:

- students enrolled at other universities who wish to **transfer** to the Pharmacy programme;
- students enrolled at the University of Rome Tor Vergata who wish to **change their programme of study**.

After being admitted in the ranking list, these students must submit the transfer or programme change request within the **enrolment deadlines**, following the procedures described in **Annex 1**.

Students who already hold a university degree or who have previously undertaken university studies may request advanced standing (abbreviazione di corso).

After completing enrolment, they must submit a written request to the Student Affairs Office, together with documentation of previously completed examinations and course syllabi validated by the issuing institution.

Important note:

Students admitted through transfer or change of programme who also hold additional qualifications or have completed studies at foreign universities must request recognition of previous studies at the time of enrolment, following the procedures indicated on the Pharmacy programme website.

Requests submitted at a later stage or requests for integration of previously recognised exams will not be accepted.

Art. 14 – Applicants with foreign qualifications and international applicants requiring a visa

Applicants holding a **foreign secondary school qualification** must possess a diploma obtained after **at least 12 years of schooling**, in accordance with the relevant ministerial guidelines.

Applicants are specifically invited to consult the relevant annexes concerning qualifications obtained in the United States, the United Kingdom, International Baccalaureate programmes, the Republic of San Marino, European Schools, and foreign schools operating in Italy.

International applicants requiring a visa must submit a **pre-enrolment application through the University portal**:

The pre-enrolment application must be submitted no later than 10 June 2026 in order to participate in the selection procedure.

After submitting the application, they must wait for validation by the University and then contact the relevant **Italian diplomatic authorities** to complete the visa procedure.

All applicants holding a foreign qualification and international applicants requiring a visa who are successful in the selection procedure must complete enrolment within the deadlines set out in this Call.

At the time of enrolment, foreign qualifications must be accompanied by the documentation indicated at the following links:

In case of irregularities in the documentation relating to the foreign qualification, enrolment will be automatically cancelled ex officio.

International students legally residing in Italy with a residence permit for study purposes who, in the academic year 2025/2026, were enrolled in single-subject courses at this or another Italian university must have successfully passed at least one exam related to those courses in order to complete enrolment.

The single course must be relevant to the Pharmacy programme.

Single courses in English language are not considered valid for this purpose.

International students holding a foreign qualification must complete enrolment in person no later than 5 November 2026 at the International Students Office (Via Cracovia 50, Rome), where enrolment will be validated and the student ID number assigned.

Non-EU students holding a valid residence permit and a qualification obtained in an Italian education system must complete enrolment within the deadlines at the Student Affairs Office of the School of Mathematics, Physics and Natural Sciences, which will verify the residence permit and assign the student ID number.

Art. 15 – Students with disabilities or specific learning disorders (SLD)

Students with certified disabilities or diagnosed **Specific Learning Disorders (SLD)** must declare their status during registration on the **Delphi portal**.

Certification must be uploaded during registration on the CISIA platform and will be evaluated by the university where the test is taken.

For Tor Vergata University of Rome, the CARIS Office (Disability and SLD Support Service) will assess the documentation and authorise any requested accommodations.

Students may request compensatory measures, assistive tools and additional time when registering for the CISIA test.

Students must submit the relevant certification to the **CARIS Office**:

Applicants residing abroad must upload certification accompanied by a sworn translation into Italian or English issued by the competent diplomatic authorities.

The CARIS Office will evaluate the documentation and communicate the outcome to the candidate.

Requests for **fee exemptions or additional support services** must be submitted at the time of enrolment.

All sensitive documentation will be handled in compliance with applicable **data protection regulations**.

Art. 16 – Processing of personal data
